Mayor Nielson called the hearing to order at 7:06 p.m. and stated that the hearing had been duly advertised according to law and was for the purpose of hearing comment on the proposed Federal Revenue Sharing for 1982-1983. The Mayor then asked City Administrator Vance Bishop to introduce the issue. Mr. Bishop explained several points in the budget which he said was approximately the same as last week. He said that his draft reflected some changes proposed by the Mayor, including contributions to be made by IPA. In answer to a question from a council member, he explained revenue sharing. He said that he anticipated \$54,000.00 in Federal revenue sharing monies. The amount which the city receives is worked out on a formula with 3 components; population, the taxing effort and the level of income of the community. Mr. Bishop explained that his philosophy on revenue sharing is that it should not be relied on for routine budget items in case the program is cut. He then explained how the monies were budgeted.


1. \$20,000.00 for a computer to be matched by IPA.
2. \$4,050.00 for office equipment for recorder and treasurer.
3. \$7,795.00 for the Street department (Hot patch equip.).
5. \$15,000.00 Engineering fees on the drainage study.
6. \$6,500.00 vehicle for the building inspector.
7. \$650.00 for audit service for the recorders department


Total: \$54,000.00.

He explained that revenue sharing money can be used for any expenditure except retirement of debt. He reported that IPA would be studying the proposed budget and reporting back next week. He said there would be further discussion with IPA on the computer, fire truck and a police officer position which had been budgeted for 1982-83.
