Mayor Dafoe called the Public Hearing to order at 6:30 p.m. Dorothy Jeffery, City Recorder, acted as secretary. Mayor Dafoe stated that notice of the meeting time, place and agenda was posted at the principal office of the governing body located at 76 North 200 West and was provided to the Millard County Chronicle/Progress, and to each member of the City Council by personal delivery two days prior to the meeting.

Mayor Dafoe explained that the purpose of the Public Hearing was to receive public comment regarding Millard County's Solid Waste Management Plan. He then he asked Robyn Pearson, Millard County Administrator, to present that plan.

Robyn Pearson explained that recently the Federal Government adopted new administrative rules for the establishment of Uniform Landfill laws that will govern the way landfills are administered and operated throughout the United States. These laws and rules will be consistent and uniform throughout the United States. In conjunction, the State of Utah was also asked to adopt an administrative code that would also govern the disposal of solid waste in the State of Utah. After the State adopted its plan it designated the counties as the coordinating organization to assist in the development of the State-wide management plan. It also necessitates the adoption of a county-wide solid waste plan, which will basically address solid waste for the next 20 years.

Millard County is in the position of putting together a plan which will address solid waste management for the next 20 years. In this process the State has proceeded to classify landfills. They are classified as follows:

- Class I. Over 20 ton of solid waste per day
- Class II. 20 ton or less per day
- Class III. Industrial Solid Waste Sites.
- Class IV. Limited to construction or demolition type waste
- Class V. Hazardous Waste Sites.

Mr. Pearson addressed questions from the Mayor and City Council regarding Millard County's Solid Waste Management Plan. Discussion was then held regarding the transporting of waste to the dumpsite and to the landfill. It was then recommended that signs be posted along 350 East Street warning against transporting waste without being covered.

Mayor Dafoe declared the meeting adjourned at 6:44 p.m.
