Chairman Nielson called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. He stated that notice of the meeting time, place and agenda had been posted at the City Building and had been provided to the Millard County Chronicle-Progress, posted on the Utah State Public Notice website, posted on the Delta City website and provided to each member of the Municipal Shooting Range Advisory Board at least two days prior to the meeting.

MINUTES

WHITE RIVER ACADEMY PROJECT

Chairman Nielson stated that Board Member Bill Keel had a presentation from a student, Hunter Rainy, from the White River Academy. Board Member Keel said that they had been doing some work on their project. He said that they had been moving dirt from the berm, and he said they think they have a solution on how to create a more permanent fix for that. Mr. Rainy stated that whereas he was looking for a service project to benefit the community, he drew up a sketch for a more permanent solution for the dirt coming off the hill at the shooting range using railroad ties, new limestone, and any ideas the board deems fit. Chairman Nielson had a question regarding the placement of holes between the existing holes. Todd Anderson stated he had talked to Ken Clark with Delta City and they were contemplating using staggered tires behind and up the target site, filled with compacted gravel for deflection. There was a discussion on combining the two ideas with the board. It was decided to do this project in sections with ties, beginning with one row and moving up as they go until they see how this works. Ken Clark said he could help with the equipment and getting some lime chips hauled in. It was decided to do Railroad ties on the target line and tires and gravel on the side hill for the first phase.

SHOOTING RANGE RULES AND ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES

Chairman Nielson stated he had asked everyone to come up with five rules for the present meeting and a discussion ensued. After a long discussion, it was suggested by Chairman Nielson that he would put together a list of the rules and e-mail to all board members.

SHOOTING RANGE SIGNAGE

Chairman Nielson asked if there were any suggestions for a vendor that could make a presentable and lasting sign and if there were funds available for such. Ken Clark responded with various ideas that would be decided upon on at a later date.

REVIEW/FINALIZE PROPOSALS FOR EARTHWORK ON SMALL BORE RANGE/RIFLE RANGE TARGET LINE APPROACH RAMP

Chairman Nielson brought to the table the discussion of the finalization of the earthwork on the range line approach ramp. A discussion followed. Chairman Nielson's idea was to build a gradual ramp up from the bench rest, and it was agreed this was a good idea. They discussed briefly how this would be done.

NEW BUSINESS

A member mentioned that Rex Stanworth had gone out to look at the rifle range and noticed that where they put the plating up there was a little lip created and a lot of people are stacking clay pigeons in the lip. He noticed a lot of pock marks on the top of the rifle range. He would like to see the lip eliminated. There was a discussion about the said problem, and it was decided that having clear rules would help alleviate this problem.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There were no matters of unfinished business on the agenda.

Chairman Nielson declared the meeting adjourned at 8 p.m.
