Mayor Bunker called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. He stated that notice of the meeting time, place and agenda had been posted at the City Building and provided to the Millard County Chronicle/Progress and to each member of the City Council at least two days prior to the meeting. City Recorder Gregory Schafer acted as secretary.

Council Member Kiley Chase provided opening remarks following which Mayor Bunker led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES

The proposed minutes of a Public Hearing held February 1, 2007 were presented for consideration and approval. Following review, Council Member Bruce Curtis MOVED to approve the minutes of the Public Hearing held February 1, 2007, as presented. The motion was SECONDED by Council Member Glen Swalberg. Mayor Bunker asked if there were any comments or questions regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a vote. The motion passed unanimously.

The proposed minutes of a Regular City Council Meeting held February 1, 2007 were presented for consideration and approval. Following review, Council Member Glen Swalberg MOVED to approve the minutes of the Regular City Council Meeting held February 1, 2007, as presented. The motion was SECONDED by Council Member Bruce Curtis. Mayor Bunker asked if there were any comments or questions regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a vote. The motion passed unanimously.

ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

The Council reviewed the accounts payable, a copy of which had been given to them two days prior to the meeting. Following review, Council Member Glen Swalberg MOVED to approve the accounts payable dated March 1, 2007, in the amount of \$152,052.50. The motion was SECONDED by Council Member Robert Banks. Mayor Bunker asked if there were any comments or questions regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a vote. The motion passed unanimously.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There were no items of unfinished business on the agenda.

NEW BUSINESS

MAYOR GAYLE BUNKER: RESOLUTION NO. 07-315 PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2006-2007 BUDGET OF THE CITY OF DELTA, UTAH

Mayor Gayle Bunker and City Recorder Gregory Schafer discussed the proposed amendments to the Delta City Budget for Fiscal Year 2006-2007 and presented the following resolution:

A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION 06-309 AND THE BUDGET ADOPTED
THEREBY TO PROVIDE FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2006-2007
BUDGET OF THE CITY OF DELTA, UTAH

Following discussion of the proposed amendments, Council Member Robert Banks MOVED to adopt Resolution No. 07-315, a resolution amending Resolution 06-309 and the budget adopted thereby to provide for amendments to the Fiscal Year 2006-2007 budget of the City of Delta, Utah. The motion was SECONDED by Council Member Bruce Curtis. Mayor Bunker asked if there were any comments or questions regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a roll call vote. MAYOR GAYLE BUNKER: REPORT ON CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION WINTER FESTIVAL AND UPCOMING CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION EVENTS

Council Members felt that the Winter Festival was very successful and well attended. Mayor Bunker reported he was pleased with the events and the number of people who attended the celebration.

Mayor Bunker asked Council Members about the birthday cake decoration in the City Park as to whether it should be left in the park or removed until later in the year. Council Members felt that the cake decoration should be left in place until after the Fourth of July celebration.

Mayor Bunker talked with a gentleman in St. George who is willing to bring a stagecoach to Delta for the Fourth of July Parade. Council Members were in favor of having the stagecoach for the parade. The Centennial Committee will be meeting next week to complete plans for the Spring Festival on April 12th.

Mayor Bunker asked Council Members where the sculpture being donated by the elementary schools should be located in the park. Council Members felt that the sculpture should be placed near the water fall. Plans are for the sculpture to be put in place on April 1st.

MAYOR GAYLE BUNKER: REVIEW OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO SECTION 13-331, REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF DELTA CITY (1981 EDITION)

Mayor Bunker reported that there has recently been some problems with controlling noise and our current ordinance needs to be amended to provide better control over excess noise. City Attorney Kaela Jackson noted that our current ordinance is very vague and difficult to enforce. City Attorney Jackson has drafted amendments to the ordinance to provide more detail, making the ordinance easier to enforce. This proposed amendment will be discussed again when additional details have been obtained regarding noise levels and distances.

MAYOR GAYLE BUNKER: UPDATE ON PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS

Mayor Gayle Bunker noted that Public Works Director Alan Riding and Assistant Public Works Director Ken Clark are attending a rural water conference in St. George. Mayor Bunker reported that public works employees had erected shelters for the Snow Goose Festival and many compliments were heard regarding the employees being on time and very professional in completing the job with no complaints or negative comments. Mayor Bunker also reported receiving many positive comments about the extra work the public works employees did in preparing the pavilion for the centennial celebration on February 23rd.

The waterfall has been refurbished and is again running. White River Academy students assisted with re-placing rocks in the stream bed and volunteered to come back once each month to put the

rocks back into proper placement.

Public Works employees read water meters this week in preparation for utility billing. Also, the trees along Shepherd Lane have been cut down. In the near future, stumps will be removed to below ground level.

Mayor Bunker reported that he had attended a banquet at the Utah Rural Water conference in St. George where Rita Byrd was recognized as Office Person of the Year and presented a plaque. Mayor Bunker distributed copies of the program honoring Mrs. Byrd.

OTHER BUSINESS

Mayor Bunker noted that Council Members had previously discussed a proposal to request that people not smoke in the City Park and asked whether Council Members were in favor of going ahead with that proposal. Council Members felt that we should request that people not smoke in the park.

Mayor Bunker reported that he had obtained forms to request an appropriation from the federal government for construction of the civic center facility. The forms need to be completed and turned in next week. There is no guarantee that funds will be allocated but it is certain that fund will not be allocated if we do not make a request.

Council Member Bruce Curtis attended the meeting of Mayors with the County Commission last evening. He reported that they had discussed control of Mormon crickets and requested that everyone watch and report any sightings of the crickets so that spray can be applied to control them. The Bureau of Land Management thanked all the fire departments for their assistance during last year's fire season and expressed concern regarding the upcoming fire season, during which local fire departments will again be asked to assist in fighting fires. New County Building Inspector, Gary Walker, introduced himself and discussed his responsibilities.

Council Member Betty Jo Western noted that the Women in Motion Conference has requested that Delta City have a booth at the conference to highlight and promote the centennial celebration. The conference is scheduled for March 17th at Delta High School beginning at 8:00 a.m. It is expected the conference will draw 500 - 700 women. There will be no charge for the booth space but the individual attending the conference to "man" the booth will be charged a registration fee for the conference, which will include a luncheon.


