Mayor Bunker called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. He stated that notice of the time, place and agenda of the meeting had been posted at the City Building, on the Utah Public Notice website, the Delta City website, and had been provided to the Millard County Chronicle/Progress and to each member of the City Council at least two days prior to the meeting.

Council Member Robert Banks provided opening remarks, following which Mayor Bunker led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES

The proposed minutes of a Regular City Council Meeting held June 20, 2013 were presented for consideration and approval. Following discussion, Council Member Robert Banks MOVED to approve the minutes of the Regular City Council Meeting held June 20, 2013, as presented. The motion was SECONDED by Council Member Tom Stephenson. Mayor Bunker asked if there were any comments or questions regarding the motion. There being none, he called for a vote. The motion passed with Council Members Robert Banks, John Niles, and Tom Stephenson voting in favor and Council Members Steven Pratt and Betty Jo Western being absent.

Council Member Steven Pratt arrived at the meeting at 7:04 p.m.

1 MAYOR GAYLE BUNKER: REVIEW OF FOURTH OF JULY CELEBRATION

3 Mayor Bunker asked Council Members for comments or observations regarding the celebration.
4 Council Member Stephenson heard from a person who was not happy that 50 South Street was closed
5 to traffic but all other comments were positive. Other Council Members reported positive comments.
6 Many people enjoyed the flyover by local pilots in place of the military flyover, which was cancelled
7 due to federal budget constraints. There were also several complaints about kids getting too close to
8 the parade entries and the possibility of having walkers alongside parade entries in the future. It was
9 suggested that we may lose some parade entries if walkers were required. Council Members felt that
10 the set up for the fish catch was better this year and it went smoother. Council Members decided to
11 consider requiring walkers alongside parade entries next year.

13 PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR ALAN RIDING: UPDATE ON PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS

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15 In the absence of Public Works Director Alan Riding, Assistant Public Works Director Ken Clark
16 reported that Public Works employees have been working on cleaning up from wind damage on the
17 night of July 4th, which resulted in numerous limbs being down in the parks and other places. He
18 reported that the Sherwood Water Project is still waiting on the boring company to get the pipe pulled
19 under Gunnison Bend Reservoir. They have had multiple equipment failures and the pipe has not yet
20 been put in place. Other than problems with the boring project, everything else is in place on the
21 Sherwood Water Project. We have meters and boosters in place and have done readings.

23 Assistant Public Works Director Clark reported receiving numerous requests that some of the patriotic
24 hats worn by City personnel during the Fourth of July celebration be available for purchase as
25 souvenirs. Council Member Pratt reported he had also had someone wanting a hat like he was
26 wearing during the celebration.

28 Assistant Public Works Director Clark reported the fuel system at the airport is finally up and
29 running. A new circuit board needed to be installed in order to complete the repairs.

31 Public Works employees will be working on storm drains for the community center project and begin
32 chip sealing some streets on August 5th. Assistant Public Works Director Clark noted that the Council
33 had previously discussed purchasing some security cameras for the park but it was decided that
34 cameras would not be purchased at that time. Public Works Department employees would like to
35 obtain bids for purchase of security cameras at this time in order to better monitor activities at the City
36 Park. We are experiencing some problems with graffiti and damage in the park area.

38 Council Member John Niles requested that Public Works employees be told how much they are
39 appreciated and compliment them on doing a great job.
