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14 **MINUTES**

15 The proposed minutes of the Delta Municipal Shooting Range Advisory Board held 08/07/2013
16 were presented for consideration and approval. Following the discussion, Board Member Bill
17 Keel MOTIONED to adopt the minutes of the Delta Municipal Shooting Range Advisory Board
18 Meeting held August 7, 2013, as presented. The motion was SECONDED by Board Member
19 Joshua Painter. Chairman Nielson asked if there were any comments or questions regarding the
20 motion. There being none, he called for a vote. The motion passed.

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22 **BUSINESS**

23 **Progress Report on White River Academy Projects**

24 Chairman Rick Nielson thanked Member Bill Keel for applying the rubber at the range. Member
25 Bill Keel introduced Hunter Rainy and Jim Bart. He turned the time over to them to report on
26 their respective projects. Hunter Rainy, student from White River Academy, reported about his
27 project with lining the pistol targets with railroad ties. He stated that he completed his plan,

28 and his fund raiser for the project. Mr. Rainy said that he also has everything that he needs to
29 begin his project. He stated that he went out to the range and sprayed ant killer to begin. His
30 next step will to begin labor on this project with a completion date in November. Jim Barto,
31 student of White River Academy, reported that his project was to install 330 feet of fencing
32 along the river. He stated that he has secured the materials for his project, and raised funds by
33 working. Mr. Barto said that he still needs to finish fundraising and that he plans to complete
34 the project in the middle of November.

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36 Delta City Works Coordination with White River Academy
37 Delta City Representative, Ken Clark, made arrangements to coordinate schedules in assisting
38 with the White River Academy Shooting Range projects. Mr. Clark stated that it would be better
39 for the City crew to schedule before November because of pending City projects.

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41 NRA Grant Applications for Shooting Range Projects
42 Chairman Rick Nielson stated that Craig Nielson, Friends of NRA, was unable to attend the
43 meeting. Mr. Craig Nielson did say that the grant applications must be submitted by the end of
44 October. Chairman Nielson stated that it was imperative to get a grant committee together to
45 meet with Mr. Craig Nielson and his wife, who has experience writing grants. Chairman Nielson
46 also stated that the Board needed to choose a project to raise the grant money for. The Board
47 discussed different possibilities, including bench covers and bench rests, target stands and a
48 cement strip to shoot from. It was decided by the Board to appoint Members Steve Broderick,
49 Josh Painter and Chairman Rick Nielson as the committee to put together the NRA grant.

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51 Other Business
52 Chairman Rick Nielson asked if there was any other business. The question regarding the
53 Shooting Range Signs, and Chairman Nielson claimed that he is in the process of simplifying the
54 signs. City Attorney Todd Anderson asked if there was a rule regarding alcohol on the sign.
55 Chairman Nielson stated that "No Alcohol" was a good rule to add.
56 There were no other matters of discussion. Chairman Rick Nielson declared the meeting
57 adjourned at 7:43 p.m.
