WATER CONSERVATION

We understand that it has been hot, windy, dry and that your lawns are looking parched, but that is normal in a desert, and they will come back. Here are a few water saving ideas to try at home:

-Only do full loads of laundry to maximize your efficiency.
-Water brown spots in your lawn with a hose instead of increasing the irrigation time on your timer.
-Place children's water toys on any dry spots in your lawn.
-Instead of washing your car in the street or driveway, park it on the lawn where it won't go to waste.
-Take the pets outside to be bathed, pick a dry spot in the lawn to wash them.

GENERAL REMINDERS

-Please keep an eye on your weeds: Overgrown vegetation can pose a fire risk and, if allowed to seed, can spread problems over a wide area.
-Remember that living in travel trailers within city limits is not permitted, though temporary permits may be issued if you have an active residential building permit.
-If you spot a streetlight that's out, jot down the pole number and report it to Pacific Power at 1-888-221-7070. They typically address these issues within 10 business days.
